


Evangelism Explosion Study of American Christians' Openness to Talking about Faith

A SURVEY OF 1,011 AMERICANS

Methodology


- The study was originated and commissioned by Evangelism Explosion
- The online survey of 1,011 American Christians was conducted by Lifeway Research April 12-23, 2022 using a national pre-recruited panel
- Quotas and slight weights were used to balance gender, age, region, ethnicity, education, and religion to more accurately reflect the population
- The completed sample is 1,011 surveys
- The sample provides 95% confidence that the sampling error from the panel does not exceed <u>+</u>3.1% This margin of error accounts for the effect of weighting
- Margins of error are higher in sub-groups

8 out of 10 say that their Christian faith impacts every aspect of their everyday life






66% of those surveyed have been a Christian for at least 49 years






93% say they are at least somewhat open to having a conversation about faith with a friend






81% say they are open to having a conversation about faith with a stranger






93% say they are open to having a conversation about the Christian faith with a friend









Among American who Identify as Christians




58% have prayed in the last month that a friend would put their trust in Jesus Christ
























"Which of the following describe how you feel about evangelism?"




"Which of the following describe how you believe most non-Christians feels about evangelism?"




Being proactive or reactive in evangelism are more common than not talking about faith at all
















69% agree that it is the responsibility of Christians to encourage non-Christians to trust Christ as their savior














52% are sure they will be with God in heaven, 23% hope so, and 9% say no one can know

Significant Statistical Differences

Christian Beliefs

Christian Beliefs are defined by responses to the question, "If God asked you, 'Why should I let you into my heaven?' What would you say?"

- Respondents who selected, "I trust in Jesus Christ alone" were categorized as having Christian Beliefs
- Respondents who selected the remaining answer options were categorized as not having Christian Beliefs

"My Christian faith impacts every aspect of my everyday life."

- Those age 65+ are the most likely to Disagree (28%)
- African Americans are the most likely to Agree (91%)
- Those in the South (83%) are more likely to Agree than those in the Northeast (73%)
- Those who have been a Christian for 1 to 17 years (87%), 18-29 (87%), and 30-49 years (83%) are more likely to Agree than those prefer not to answer (58%) and those who have been a Christian for 65+ years (67%)
- Pre-COVID, those who attended a worship service 4 or more times a month are the most likely to Agree (95%)
- Those who presently attend a worship service 4 or more times a month are the most likely to Agree (96%)
- Those with Christian beliefs are more likely to Agree than those without Christian beliefs (90% v. 70%)

"How open are you to having a conversation about faith with a friend?"

- Those age 65+ are most likely to select "Somewhat open/Open" (57%)
- African Americans (56%) are more likely to select "Very open" than Whites (44%)
- Those in the South (49%) and West (51%) are more likely to select "Very open" than those in the Northeast (38%)
- Those with a Bachelor's Degree (52%) or a Graduate Degree (56%) are more likely to select "Very open" than who are High School graduates or less (41%)
- Those who have been a Christian for 65+ years are the least likely to select "Very open" (30%)
- Pre-COVID, those who attended a worship service 4 or more times a month are the most likely to select "Very open" (66%)
- Those who presently attend a worship service 4 or more times a month are the most likely to select "Very open" (68%)
- Those with Christian beliefs are the most likely to select "Very open" than those without Christian beliefs (56% v. 36%)

"How open are you to having a conversation about faith with a stranger?"

- Those age 65+ are the most likely to select "Not open at all" (29%)
- African Americans (42%) are more likely to select "Very open" than Whites (30%) and Hispanics (31%)
- Those with a Bachelor's Degree (20%) are more likely to select "Not open at all" than those with a Graduate Degree (9%)
- Those who have been a Christian for 18 to 29 years (36%) and 30-49 years (37%) are more likely to select "Very open" than those prefer not to answer (10%) and those who have been a Christian for 65+ years (11%)
- Pre-COVID, those who attended a worship service 4 or more times a month are the most likely to select "Very open" (46%)
- Those who presently attend a worship service 4 or more times a month are the most likely to select "Very open" (50%)
- Those with Christian beliefs are more likely to select "Very open" than those without Christian beliefs (39% v. 24%)

- Whites (38%) and Other Ethnicities (42%) are more likely to select "0 times" than African Americans (24%)
- Those in the Midwest (43%) are more likely to select "0 times" than those in the South (33%) and West (31%)
- Those who have been a Christian for 50-64 years (49%), 65+ years (51%), and prefer not to answer (54%) are more likely to select "0 times" than those who have been a Christian for 1 to 17 years (16%), 18 to 29 years (25%), and 30-49 years (29%)
- Pre-COVID, those who attended a worship service less than once a month are the most likely to select "0 times" (64%)
- Those who presently attend a worship service less than once a month are more likely to select "0 times" (61%)
- Those with Christian beliefs are less likely to select "0 times" than those without Christian beliefs (26% v. 45%)

- Those who have been a Christian for 50-64 years (76%), 65+ years (92%), and prefer not to answer (88%) are more likely to select "0 times" than those who have been a Christian for 1 to 17 years (45%), 18 to 29 years (51%), and 30-49 years (53%)
- Pre-COVID, those who attended a worship service less than once a month are the most likely to select "0 times" (90%)
- Those who presently attend a worship service less than once a month are the most likely to select "0 times" (89%)

- Those age 65+ are the most likely to select "0 times" (84%)
- Other Ethnicities (73%) are more likely to select "0 times" than African Americans (49%) and Hispanics (55%)

- Those who have been a Christian for 50-64 years (73%), 65+ years (88%), and prefer not to answer (84%) are more likely to select "0 times" than those who have been a Christian for 1 to 17 years (41%), 18 to 29 years (50%), and 30-49 years (48%)

- African Americans (28%) are more likely to select than Whites (13%) and Hispanics (13%)
- Those who have been a Christian for 1 to 17 years (20%), 18-29 years (22%), and 30 to 49 (19%) are more likely to select than those who have been a Christian for 50 to 64 years (9%), 65+ (3%), and prefer not to answer (9%)
- Pre-COVID, those who attended a worship service 4 or more times a month are the most likely to select (24%)
- Those who presently attend a worship service less than once a month are the least likely to select (5%)

I'm willing

- Those age 18-29 are the most likely to select (56%)
- African Americans are the most likely to (58%)
- Those in the Northeast are the least likely to select (27%)
- Those with a Bachelor's Degree (44%) or a Graduate Degree (50%) are more likely to select than those who are High School graduates or less (35%)
- Those who have been a Christian for 1 to 17 years (56%), 18 to 29 years (49%), and 30 to 49 (43%) are more likely to select than those who have been a Christian for 65+ (12%), and prefer not to answer (22%)
- Pre-COVID, those who attended a worship service less than once a month are the least likely to select (18%)
- Those who presently attend a worship service less than once a month are the least likely to select (21%)
- Those with Christian beliefs are more likely to select than those without Christian beliefs (50% v. 28%)

I'm reluctant

I'm indifferent

• Those who have been a Christian for 1 to 17 years (19%) are more likely to select than those who have been a Christian for 18 to 29 years (9%), 30 to 49 years (9%), 50 to 64 years (8%), and 65+ years (10%)

It's pushy

- Those age 65+ (45%) are more likely to select than those age 30-49 (32%)
- Whites (38%) and Hispanics (42%) are more likely to select than African Americans (28%)
- Those who have been a Christian for 65+ years (53%) are more likely to select than those who have been a Christian for 18 to 29 years (31%), 30 to 49 years (34%), 50 to 64 years (37%) and prefer not to answer (31%)

- Those a Bachelor's Degree (28%) or a Graduate Degree (34%) are more likely to select than those with some college (18%)
- Those who have been a Christian for 65+ years are the least likely to select (6%)
- Pre-COVID, those who attended a worship service less than once a month are the least likely to select (12%)
- Those who presently attend a worship service less than once a month are the least likely to select (12%)

"Which statement best describes how proactive or reactive you are with evangelism (telling others about Jesus Christ)?"

- Those age 18-29 (20%) and 30-49 (23%) are more likely to select "I try to bring up faith in conversations with everyone" than those age 50-64 (9%) and 65+ (4%)
- African Americans (37%) and Hispanics (35%) are more likely to select "I look for natural opportunities to bring up faith" than Whites (25%)
- Those in the Northeast (27%) are more likely to select "I won't talk about faith with most people" than those in the South (17%)
